Grassy Field – Morning Visuals: LOW ANGLE through the tall swaying grass Visuals: large-format camera left of frame Visuals: photo of Bob right of frame Visuals: left of frame TEXT ON SCREEN: "A Life Remembered, Bob Morrison, 1938-2009"	Narrator: Will Rosser Sounds: birds, cars, ambient, wild sound, water Music: Soft valley/rural
Scene 2 EXT. Ohio Valley – Late Afternoon with Stormy Sky Visuals: DISSOLVE TO large, old oak to left of the frame, overlooks WS of valley, push in Visuals: DISSOLVE TO and golden tree on left of frame, push into white frame house	Voiceover: Born in Pittsburgh, Bob Morrison grew up in the rolling hills of the rich Ohio Valley. Sounds: ambient
Scene 3 EXT. Retro Scene in Field – Day Visuals: small snap-shot size photo (repeated three times, three different colors), full length of Bob as a five-year-old child	Voiceover: As a child, photography fascinated Bob. Sounds: Children laughing, birds singing
Scene 4 EXT. Retro Scene in Field – Day Visuals: small snap-shot size photo of sister Jean, right of frame Visuals: light flash at "snapped his first photo"	Voiceover: And at age 4, he snapped his first photo of his two-year-old sister Jean.

Scene 5 INT. Studio Shot Visuals: photo of Bob Morrison age nine, left of frame Visuals: photos of string of National Geographic Magazines with cover of National Geographic Magazine to right of frame	Voiceover: Neighbors of the Morrison family introduced young Bob to their collection of National Geographic magazines, influencing his life-long love of photography, reading and writing.
Scene 6 INT. Home – Fireplace – Anytime Interview: Walter Jacobs Visuals: TEXT ON SCREEN: Walter Jacob, TIVA President, 2005-2007	Interview with Walter Jacob: A lot of people knew Bob as a photographer for TIVA, Television, Internet and Video Association. They may not have even known all the things he did in his life
Scene 7 Retro photo of Bob Morrison in the Army Visuals: split screen with Bob and Walter Visuals: PUSH IN on full screen of Bob with his rifle Visuals: TEXT ON SCREEN: "In 1961, Bob served in the U.S. Army in France as a post photographer	Interview with Walter Jacob (on camera and VO):they may not have known that he served in the Army.
Scene 8 EXT — Front of National Geographic Society Building — Morning Visuals: Various still shots, straight and tilts	Interview with Walter Jacob VO: He was a talented writer who had written for National Geographic
Scene 9 EXT — Front of National Geographic Society Visuals: from full opacity to 30% of the façade of National Geographic Society building, bl/wh, background Visuals: roll in from right over background, four book covers of books worked on by Bob	Voiceover: Bob joined the organization he so admired to co-author or edit many books in his 30 years at the National Geographic Society.
Scene 10 INT. Scottish Country Dance Club – Dancing – Anytime Visuals: sepia photo, chest down, of three Scottish Country Dance contestants dancing Visuals: FADE UP color photo of Bob and Meredith posing in costume for a color photo, center of frame Visuals: PUSH IN on photo of Bob and Meredith	Voiceover: Following his passion for dancing, Bob met his future wife Meredith at a Scottish Country Dance Club. Sounds: Scottish Country Dance music

Scene 11 EXT. Bob Morrison Home, Bonnie Briar Visuals: Front Sign, full frame "Bonnier Briar" Visuals: tilt of photo of Morrison home, Bonnie Briar	Voiceover: The couple married in 1979 and moved into a beautiful home they named Bonnie Briar.
Scene 12 EXT. Bob Morrison Home, Bonnie Briar Visuals: 20% resolution of the Morrison home Visuals: FADE UP MS, CENTER, photo of family of four with two young children superimposed on screened back tilted photo of Morrison home Visuals: FADE OUT of family photo Visuals: FADE UP MS, CENTER, second photo of family of four with two teenagers superimposed on screened back tilted photo of Morrison home	Voiceover: The family grew first with the adoption of Justin in 1991 then Elizabeth in 1992. Sound: Scottish dance music
Scene 13 Campaign Poster Visuals: DISSOLVE TO campaign poster "Bob Morrison, Falls Church Treasurer Visuals: DISSOLVE TO photo of façade of City Hall with flags, and Falls Church signage "Harry E. Wells Building, City Hall, Falls Church, Virginia"	Interview with Walter Jacob VO: Bob was elected three times as the treasurer of the City of Falls Church.

DC Central Kitchen – Anytime Visuals: Dissolve to 50% sepia screened background photo of Bob and two members of the DC Central Kitchen giving Bob an award Visuals: layered over photo, right of frame, the frying pan award Visuals: frying pan with text: Bob Morrison, Volunteer of the Year, Central Food Fight Visuals: fly in from right a ¼ size of sepia screen of background photo Visuals: under smaller photo, TEXT ON SCREEN: "Bob awarded 'Volunteer of the Year, Chef Competition, Capital Food Fight'"	Interview with Don Hagen VO: Bob was involved in many activities. He was very active in the DC Central Kitchen.

Voiceover: As the official photographer for the D.C. Central Kitchen's colorful cookbook, Bob was really cookin'!
Interview with Don Hagen (on camera and VO): He was our very first photographer at the PEER Awards.
Interview with Don Hagen (on camera and VO): He was at every event you'd go to. If you went to a TIVA event, there was Bob organizing people, putting them together.
